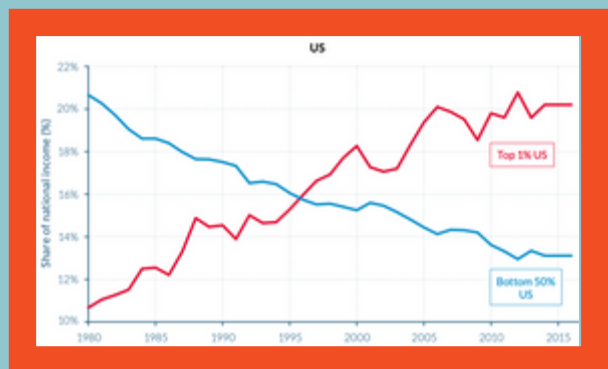

INCOME INEQUALITY

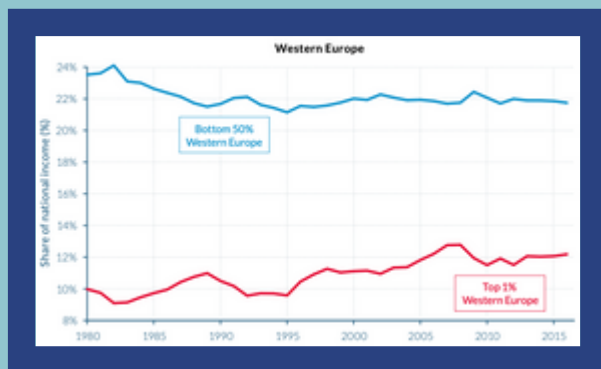
A shocking reversal in U.S.



In **1980**, the **top 1%** captured **11%** of all income. The **bottom 50%** captured **21%**.

In **2016**, the **top 1%** captured **20%** of all income. The bottom **50%** captured **13%**.

Europe stays the course



In **1980**, the **top 1%** captured **10%** of all income. The bottom **50%** captured **24%**.

In **2016**, the **top 1%** captured **12%** of all income. The bottom **50%** captured **22%**.

How does the U.S. Compare Globally?

Out of 157 countries, the U.S. is the **118th most unequal** on the GINI Index, placing it in the bottom quartile.



Income Inequality

The U.S. ranks behind countries such as Iran, The Democratic Republic of The Congo and Russia, and trails every single European nation.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING



The U.S. ranks **55th in infant mortality**, even behind countries such as **Bosnia-Herzegovina and Serbia**. At **5.8 deaths per thousand**, American-born infants have an **80% higher risk of dying** before the age of one than infants born in **France**.



The U.S. ranks **47th in maternal mortality**, even behind countries such as **Libya and Kazakstan**. At **14 deaths per 100,000 births**, U.S. mothers have a **100% higher risk of dying** in birth than mothers in **Canada**.



The U.S. ranks **43rd in life expectancy**. At roughly **81 years of age**, those born in the U.S. **live on average 2 years less** than those born in **Iceland**.



The U.S. ranks **18th in happiness**.

However...



The U.S. ranks **1st in antidepressant use**.

DEMOCRACY

VOTER TURNOUT: The U.S. ranks **26th** out of **32** industrialized nations, with only a **56% voter turnout** for the 2016 presidential election. **Belgium, Sweden and Denmark** achieved voter turnouts of **87%, 83% and 80%**, respectively.

ELECTORAL INTEGRITY: The U.S. ranks **55th** — tied with the likes of **Oman, Bhutan and Panama**.

VOTER REGISTRATION: Only **64%** of the U.S. voting-age population was **registered** during the 2016 presidential election. Canada and the U.K. have achieved **91%** voter registration in recent years, and **Sweden** has achieved **96%**.

FREEDOM: The U.S. ranks **last**, with a score of **86/100**, when compared to the countries of Western Europe. **Norway, Sweden and Finland** all received scores of **100/100**.
