Within this memo, Powell:

- **Decries** the waning health of the American economy (despite amazing health and **huge** growth in **corporate** profits)
- Calls on the beleaguered business community to spread its perspective (narrowly antigovernment & pro-market) via policy think tanks, education, media, political action, and the
