



# Broad Bipartisanship...

## Just Not in the US Congress

**As Americans, we agree on a lot more than you might think, from the economy and big \$\$ in politics to immigration and healthcare.**

**84% of Americans agree that politicians have too much economic power, and 82% agree that the rich and big corporations have too much power.**<sup>1</sup>

**84% of Americans agree that “money has too much influence” in our democracy.**<sup>2</sup>

**78% of Americans, including 80% of Republicans, oppose the Supreme Court’s Citizens United ruling that corporations should be counted as people.**<sup>3</sup>

**Nearly 80% favor limits on both raising and spending money in Congressional campaigns.**<sup>4</sup>

**2019 and 2020 polls show that 70% of American adults agree that our economic system unfairly favors powerful interests.**<sup>5</sup>

**75% of Americans favor adopting a 4% surtax on individual income above \$5 million.**<sup>6</sup>

**84% of Americans favor paid family leave.**<sup>7</sup>

**Two-thirds support a \$15 federal minimum wage.**<sup>8</sup>

**64% of Americans say they are greatly bothered by the feeling that some corporations do not pay their fair share of taxes.**<sup>9</sup>

**As of 2019, a majority of Americans—including 82% of Republicans and 93% of Democrats—favor closing gun-sale loopholes by enforcing background checks for private gun sales and at gun shows.**<sup>10</sup>

**77% of Americans now believe the US should prioritize the development of renewable energy over expanding fossil fuel production.**<sup>11</sup>

**71% favor changing the healthcare system so that any American can buy into a government-run health care plan if they prefer.**<sup>12</sup>

**71% think that most immigrants living in the US illegally should be offered a chance to apply for legal status.**<sup>13</sup>

**68% favor increased federal spending on green and renewable energy.**<sup>14</sup>

**71% are against overturning Roe v Wade.**<sup>15</sup>

**77% agree that racism is a serious problem in the US and 72% say racism is a serious problem in policing.**<sup>16</sup>
